Dear participants in the project DENK-BILDER,

In this newsletter we want to give you a little review at our activities and an outlook for the upcoming events.

About eight month ago we published the first information about the project DENK-BILDER in several magazines and on the internet. Since then our group kept advertising about our idea by flyers, posters, banner and interviews. We found sponsors, organized pretty many keynotes and introductory lectures, initiated working groups and supported them by performing workshops about the book *The Philosophy of Freedom*.

Smaller and larger groups as well as individuals started working, from Germany in Berlin, Bonn, Würzburg and Stuttgart as well as globally in Belgium and Canada, in Moscow and Samara in Russia, in Tbilisi in Georgia, and in Oriago near Venice, Italy. And we had responses from Greece, Great Britain, Scandinavia, Lanzarote/Canary Islands, from Switzerland and the USA.

Anybody could perform their own work method and tell us about her or his creative activity. A wide range of ideas and a boldness to act mark the more than 200 works of art which got to us by today—the number still increasing week by week. We are very grateful and send everybody a heartfelt thank-you.

Now we are in the phase of collecting and preparing for the Anniversary Exhibition. We do ask you once again: Do not hesitate, send in your works digitally via our website or via mail. You can find our street address on the website, too. Perfection is not the goal but your creative approach.

The deadline for the exhibition is 1 Oktober 2017. We ask everybody who is submitting her or his artwork digitally to send high resolution files. So we can maintain as much details and „freshness“ of your work for potential printing.

Be aware that the project DENK-BILDER will not end with the Anniversary Exhibition but will only start into a strong public perception. All works which we will receive later will be added for future presentations and exhibitions.
